After being missing for seven weeks, what a miracle Josie is now safe and being cared for by Wendi.

Beyond being slightly underweight and covered in brambles and mats, Josie is in remarkably good condition. When Josie is stable and given a clean bill of health, a decision will be made about rehoming. She is one terrier-tough Wheaten and we are so glad to have her back safely.

















RESCUE REPORT

It has been a very quiet quarter with only one adoption. In March, nine month old Peaches came into Rescue. Lisa and Gordy Alexander fostered the puppy - they said she sure livened up the resident dogs! Big thanks go out to them. Peaches was adopted by a nice couple in Pt. Saint Lucie and is doing well.







There is a young male Wheaten, Mackey, at the Leesburg Humane Society. He needs a good home and would be best as an only dog although he is a love bug with people. See our Facebook page for more information.

However, Rescue was only quiet on the adoption front. Three year old Josie came into Rescue at the beginning of April. Sue Sousa handled the transfer to her new adoptive family in Bradenton. When they arrived home and opened their car door, Josie bolted. She had a collar, leash and halter on. During the following six weeks an enormous, concentrated effort was made to find little Josie. We hired a trapper, a tracker, a drone person and even an animal communicator. Shelters were contacted, fliers were posted everywhere, and she saturated social media. Huge thanks go out to the boots on the ground - the people who went out every day moving cages, replenishing food and searching. Thanks to Lori Briggs, Jo-Anne Bates, Wendi Newman (who never gave up hope) and everyone who helped. On or about Friday the 17th of May, two photos of Josie were spotted on camera. Lori came to Bradenton with her cage and food, the trap was set and Josie went in! She was still wearing the halter. Wendi had her vetted and other than being a little thin, she was very This was nothing short of a miracle. In the thirty healthy. years of doing Rescue, this had never happened before. Thank you so very much to everyone who helped Josie come home!

In April, Elvis and I completed the training and received certification in HOPE, Animal - Assisted Crisis Response, to become a part of the Florida Team.

HOPE AACR Provides comfort dog teams to assist in recovery from crisis and disasters, assist mental health professionals on location, and are prepared for unpredictable situations. Teams are all volunteer, are insured and undergo regular background checks.

Teams must have a year of documented therapy experience before applying. Applicants are screened for suitability for crisis response before being accepted for training. During the screening, Elvis had to follow basic commands, stay quietly in a crate when I left the room and stay with another person when I left the room. He had to have no response to a tape simulation of the noise in Red Cross shelter during a crisis and provide comfort to people simulating someone affected by a crisis.

Once applicants are eligible, they attend a three day certification training. They receive comprehensive training in animal-assisted crisis response. The training topics include, stress management, crisis response protocols, canine behavior and welfare and field training. We had training in a fire station to see how the dogs responded to a fireman in full gear and the sirens. None of the dogs in our class had any response to the noise.

We also went through security at the airport and visited with passengers waiting for their flights.

It's amazing how Elvis can be such a good therapy dog and still be a crazy Wheaten! He is living up to his AKC name: Angel Eyes of Comfort and Joy.

IN THE KITCHEN WITH KACI & ELVIS

Peanut Butter and Banana Doggie Ice Cream

Ingredients:

- 3-4 Ripe Bananas
- 32 ounces plain yogurt, low-fat
- 1 cup peanut butter, organic

Directions:

- Add bananas, peanut butter, and yogurt to a blender.

As a breed-specific rescue organization, the club is dedicated to rescuing and rehoming SCWT's throughout the state of Florida. However, we cannot do it alone and are in need of foster homes to provide temporary care for these dogs until they can be placed with their forever homes!



We receive dogs into Rescue in several ways, but primarily...

- from individuals who wish to relinquish ownership,
- through our partnerships with FL shelters and humane societies,
- · daily social media search for SCWTs in need

Fostering provides a safe and loving environment while the dogs recuperate and wait for their forever homes. This can involve anything from providing basic care, such as feeding and grooming, to helping the dog learn basic obedience and socialization skills. As a foster parent, you will work closely with our Rescue coordinators to ensure that the dog is getting the vet care, home care and attention they need. And you will be provided with all the necessary supplies and support to ensure that the dog is happy and healthy.

Are you considering adding a new SCWT to your family? "Fostering to Adopt" is an excellent way to determine if a rescued wheaten is a good fit for your household. You will have the opportunity to spend time with the dog on a daily basis without making a long-term commitment. And should you decide you cannot live without your foster, you'll be given priority to adopt!

Fostering a SCWT in need can be a deeply fulfilling experience that greatly enhances our ability to provide rescue services to more dogs. 
Hurricane season is here! Be Prepared!

- Copies of vet records
- Rabies Certificate
- Vaccination info
- Proof of Ownership

Pet Description:

- Photos of your pet
- Written description of your pet e.g. collar, tags, etc.
- Microship information
- Your contact information




- 2 week supply of food for each animal
- Manual can opener (if needed)
- Feeding instructions for each animal
- 2 week supply of water for each animal
- Dishes
- 2 week supply of medications with instructions
- One month supply of flea, tick and heartworm preventative

- Toys
- Pet carrier with bedding
- Pet first aid book
- Pet first aid kit
- Cleaning supplies for accidents
