HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

No Scaredy Cats (or Dogs) this Halloween: Top Pet Safety Tips

1. No tricks, no treats: That bowl of candy is for trick-or-treaters, not for Scruffy and Fluffy. Chocolate in all forms—especially dark or baking chocolate—can be very dangerous for dogs and cats. Candies containing the artificial sweetener xylitol can also cause serious problems.


2. Wires and cords from electric lights and other decorations should be kept out of reach of your pets. If chewed, your pet might suffer cuts or burns, or receive a shock.

A carved pumpkin is festive, but do exercise caution if you choose to add a candle.

 Don't put your dog or cat in a costume UNLESS you know he or she loves it (yup, some pets are real hams!).

- If you do dress up your pet, make sure the costume isn't annoying or unsafe. It should not constrict the animal's movement or hearing, or impede his ability to breathe, bark or meow.
- All but the most social dogs and cats should be kept in a separate room away from the front door during peak trick-or-treating hours
- When opening the door for trick-or-treaters, take care that your cat or dog doesn't dart outside.
- 8. IDs, please! Always make sure your dog or cat has proper identification. If for any reason your pet escapes and becomes lost, a collar and tags and/or a microchip can be a lifesaver, increasing the chances that he or she will be returned to you.

RESCUE REPORT





At the end of May, four-year-old Penny was still in foster care with Sue Dela Rosa in Oldsmar. Sue fostered Penny for several weeks, got her spayed and took her to two specialists for opinions on her hip dysplasia. The good news is that her dysplasia is so mild they did not recommend surgery, so diet and medication will be sufficient. Many thanks go to Sue for doing such a great job fostering Penny. Penny went home in mid-July to a family in Cocoa Beach with older kids and a young male Wheaten for Penny to play with.

Also in July, we were contacted by two-year-old Ruby's family in Northport. They had 3 kids, full time jobs and school -not enough time for young Ruby. Thanks go to Dan Klee and his wife for scooping Ruby up and taking her to meet her foster home in Bradenton. The Rowe's have adopted two Wheatens from us. They just adore Ruby, and her foster period lasted only a couple days. She is now a permanent member of the Rowe family.





In July, we posted 10-year-old Sammy and 12-year-old Riley on our Facebook page. They are two bonded boys looking for a loving home in which to spend their golden years. Currently they are in Windermere. They are healthy, lovely boys. Please contact us if you are interested.

Eight-year-old Koda has been at our training facility Karma K-9 in Jax for many weeks. He is a sweet dog who simply needs to be in a quiet home with no other dogs. If you fit the bill, please contact us.





Our Rescue became overwhelmed in August. Isabella and Sebastian's owner in Miramar contacted us. He was working long hours and could not afford basic care for the three and eight-year-old. They were not up to date on anything and not altered. Isabella went into foster care with our long time Rescue friend Michele Rosenthal in WPB where she is thriving.

On August 4th, Sebastian went to Advanced Veterinary Care in Davie, a 24-hour emergency care facility with several specialists. Sebastian was quite sick. His kidneys were ailing. He had emergency surgery to repair one hernia and get neutered, but they could not operate on his second hernia until days later. Sebastian has been in the hospital for two weeks and Rescue has incurred thousands and thousands of dollars in vet bills. Donations would be welcome. His long-term prognosis is good but in the short term he needed major care. He will be coming to the Nelson's in Miami for some days, and then on to his foster home. He is a very sweet boy who deserves a good home.

The week of August 13th, things became quite hectic. Luna (now Katie), who we think is about two, was dumped on a farm in the rural Panhandle. There are puppy mills in the woods there, and we think Luna may have been a puppy mill mama. We arranged to get Luna to Jody Greene in Jax, who took her to her vet to be spayed and gotten current on everything. Huge thanks to Jan Dobson from Tallahassee who drove hours and hours to get her to Jody, who also helped with the WURL (Wheaten Underground Railroad Leg). Luna will be adopted by a nice family in Jax.

The same week we found out about Dickens in St. Augustine. Nine-months-old and unneutered. Jody fostered Dickens and said he is just a great dog. He should be very easy to place.



We also have 9-month-old Gucci, now Mackey, in Jax who will be coming into Rescue shortly.

This quarter we have had a flood of dogs that required basic vet care like spaying and neutering, shots, heartworm tests, blood panels. And then there is Sebastian. As I said, we welcome donations. Just go to our website, www.flwheatenclub.org, and click on the donate button!

Peck-peck; peck-peck comes the knocking every morning, A little Northern Flicker starts at sunup without warning.


I am looking for my furry friend his message seems to say, And Enzo comes a running - no matter what is in his way.


